Coronation



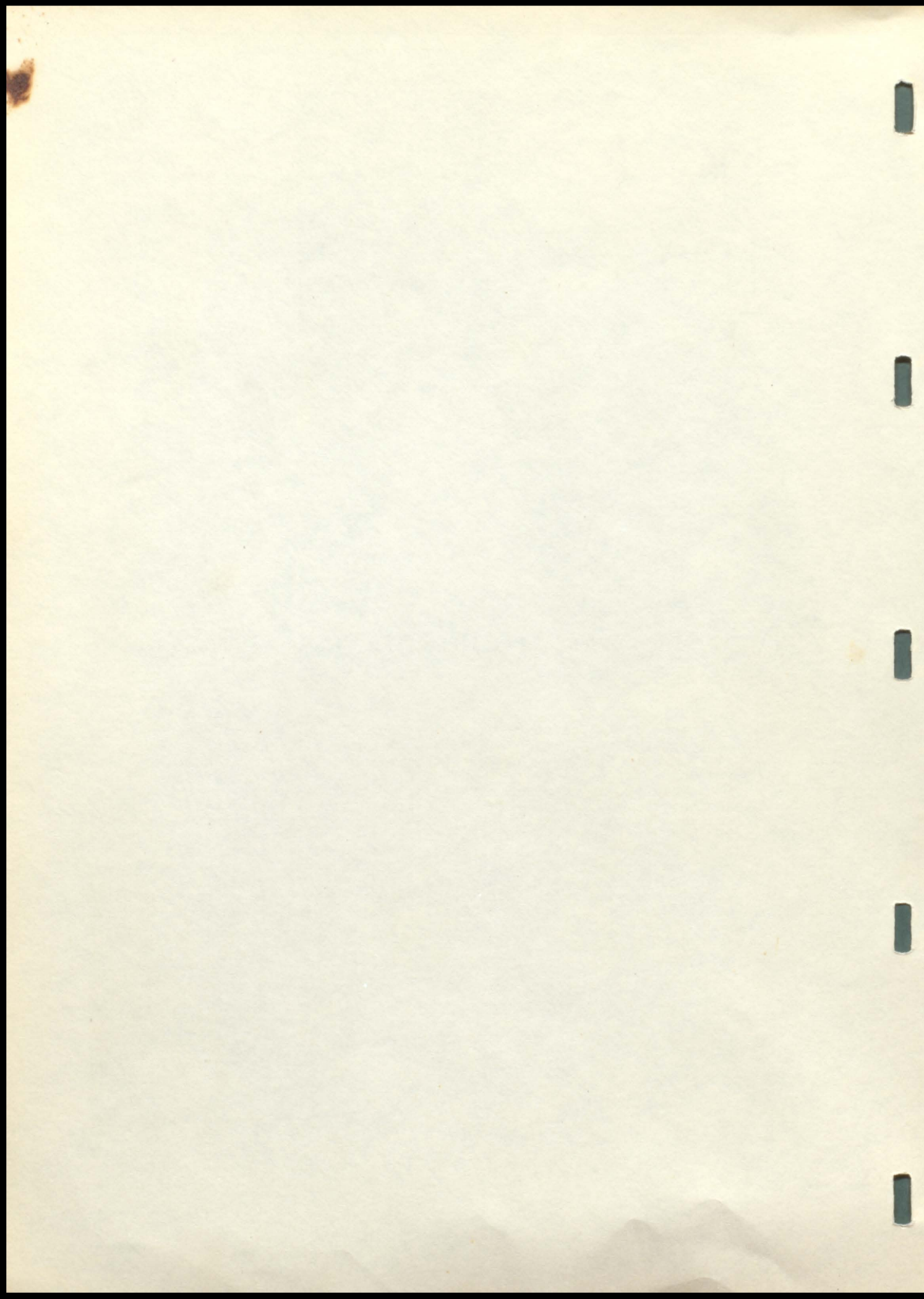
