

Once again, the EP-J harriers found a great use for the area golf courses. Not only did they make good use of the golf courses, but also set some outstanding course-breaking records. As a team, the boys finished second at the Dakota Valley and Canton Invitationals; third at the Beresford and Canton Invitationals and fourth at the Alcester-Hudson Invite. Once again, the Huskies hosted the Union County Quadrangular, Jesse Girard claimed second place and Lucas Klumper earned the fourth place medal. At the Big Sioux Conference meet, the boy's team finished with a strong second place showing. At the Region 3A meet, the

boys earned fourth out of eleven teams. L. Klumper, J. Girard and A. Fletcher advanced to the State meet. At Broadland Creek in Huron, J. Girard finished 70th with a time of 16:37, L. Klumper finished 83rd with a time of 16:49 and A. Fletcher finished 118th with a time of 17:43.

The girls didn't have enough members to make a team, so Katie Oberg and Holly Donnelly ran for individual accomplishments. Holly's best time was 17:58 and Katie's best time was 18:55 in a 4000m race.

Fletcher pushed her out of a moving car, giving her road rash, bruises and running over her foot. H. Donnelly will never forget all the times Jeff Girard hit on her and almost won her heart. Lucas Klumper was named to the Academic All-State Team.







The Husky football team entered the season with ten returning senior football players to lead the team into the '99 season. The Huskies were led defensively by the seniors. J. Lamoreaux sacked the opposition's

quarterbacks four times to lead in sacks. E. Schmitz led tackles with a whopping 76, followed by D. Trudeau with 69 tackles to his credit. S. Rubida intercepted two passes and returned them forty yards. Juniors, D. Dougherty and L. Schmidt recorded six fumble recoveries: Dougherty with four; Schmidt with two. E. Schmitz and L. Schmidt each had one blocked kick.

On the ground the Huskies rushed for 935 yards. Senior, R. Johnson led with 370 yards and two touchdowns, Johnson averaged 46.3 rushing yards per game. S. Rubida ran the ball 58 times for 256 total yards and an average of 42.7 yards per game. A. Girard completed 46.2% of his pass attempts for 138 yards before he was injured.

game. Pirner's favorite receiver, J. Guenthner, caught nine passes for 137 yards gained for an average of 15.2 yards per catch and four touchdowns. S. Rubida caught nine aerials for 160 yards at an average of 13.3 yards per catch. Rubida also scored 5 touchdowns. J. Livingston broke the pass reception record for one game by catching eight passes against Canton. A. Girard pulled in seven catches for 71 yards. E. Mollet returned five punts with a return average of 10.2 yards per carry. The Husky's season ended 0-8.






The wrestlers' team dual record of 15-3, created a new school record. The team was led by captains D. Dougherty, J. Lamoreux, and J. Wahl.









All in all everyone had a good time! The victorious seniors hope that they taught everyone how to cheat and that their skills will be passed on for years to come.




It's all about...




We received more privileges; Letting we bent the rules We did homework in groups and studied together And slept through classes that And slept through classes that dragged on forever



RICKY MARTIN


"Livin' La Vida Loca" and "She's All I Ever Had" take Ricky's first English album multi-platinum.


Richard Gere and Julia Roberts reunite in this heartwarming love story about a skittish bride-to-be.




