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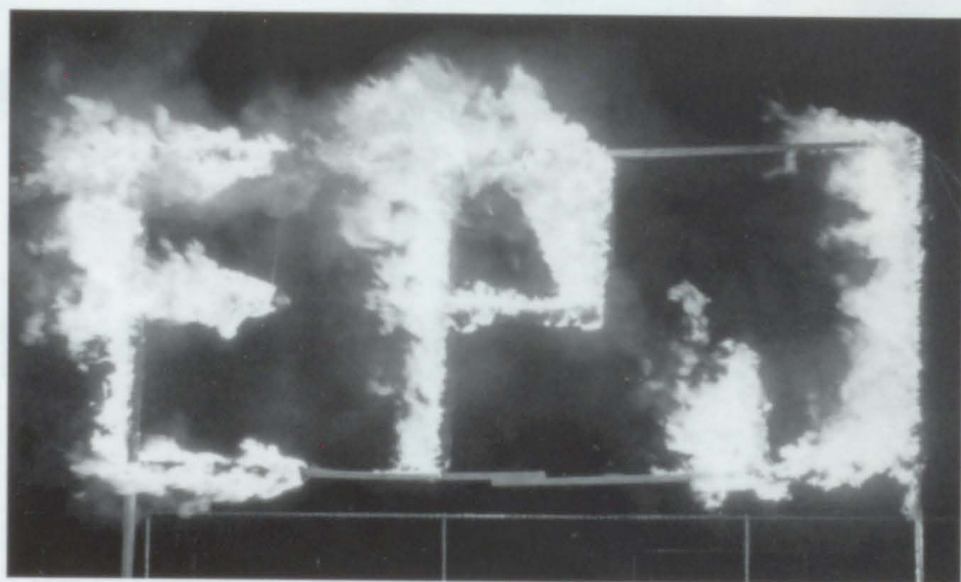
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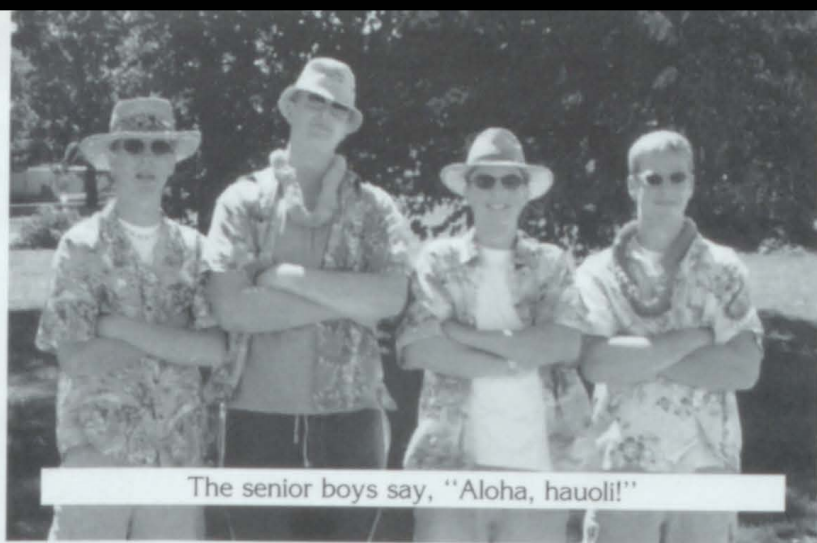

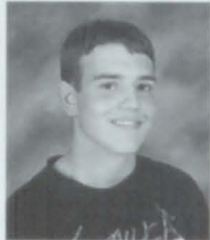

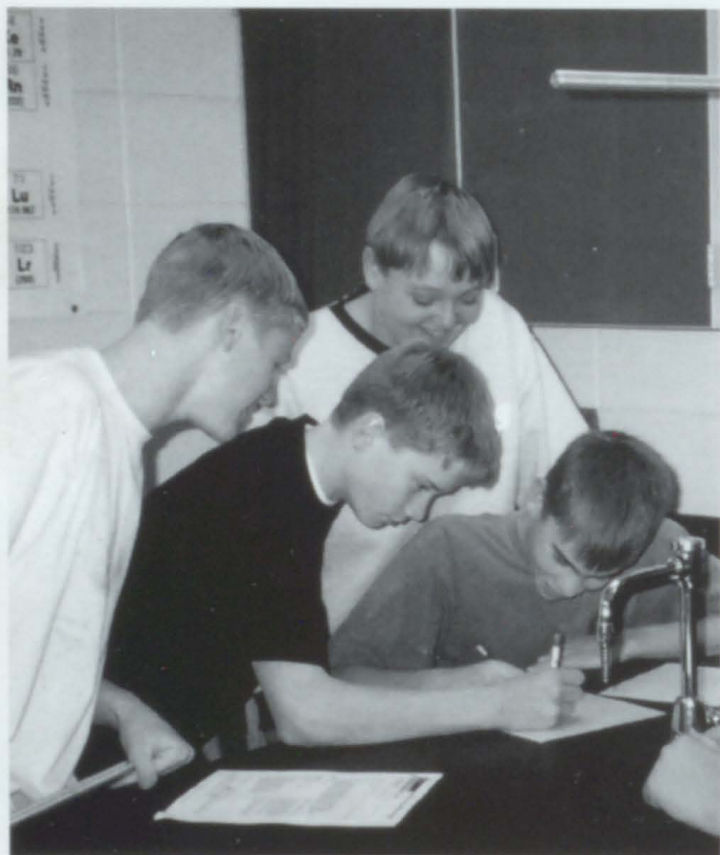

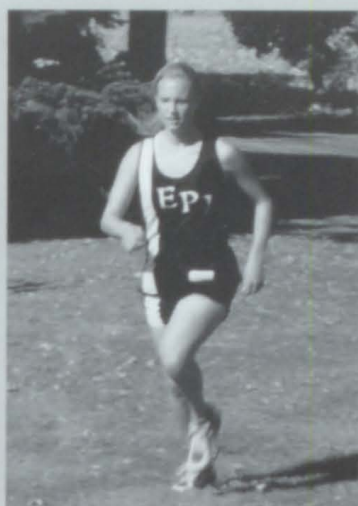

The Husky football team entered the season with ten returning senior football players to lead the team into the '99 season. The Huskies were led defensively by the seniors. J. Lamoreaux sacked the opposition's quarterbacks four times to lead in sacks. E. Schmitz led tackles with a whopping 76, followed by D. Trudeau with 69 tackles to his credit. S. Freshman, D. Pirner, took over the QB position and completed 46.6% of his passes for 437 yards or 87.4 yards per

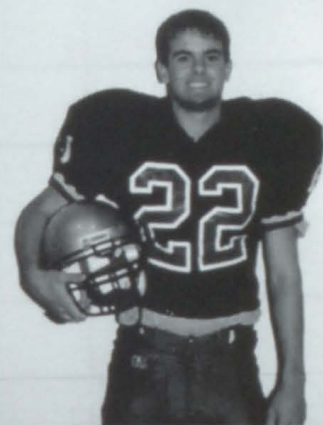

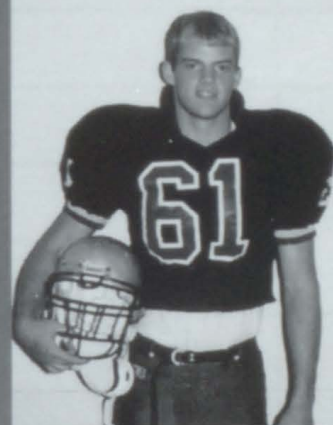

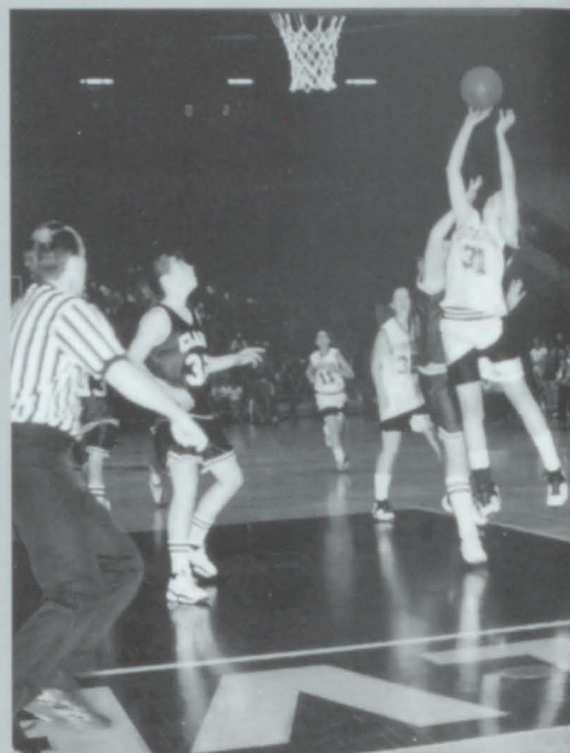
# DEFENSE

Defense is the best word that describes this year's '99 Husky girl's basketball team. Winning the first two games against two talented teams cast great confidence for the team and both communities. The team finished with a record-breaking season of 22-3. The Huskies won the conference regular season, District 8A, Region 4A, and placed 4th in the State A Tournament! S. Limoges was named to the 1st team all-conference, E. Kyte to the 2nd team all-conference, and L. Schmitz to the 3rd team all-conference. S. Limoges, L. Schmitz, and D. Fennel were named to the Academic All-State team. S. Limoges received the Big Sioux Conference MVP honors, all-Region 1st team, Region 4A Player of the Year, 2nd team All-State, and "Spirit of Su."

Statistically the Huskies finished the season strong. The Huskies averaged 53 ppg, while their opponents averaged 40.7. S. Limoges led the team with 316 points followed by E. Kyte with 287. Also scoring

above 100 was A. Lee with 152 points, S. Patnaude with 129 points, and L. Schmitz with 122 points. The team made 242 out of 421 attempts at the free throw line for a 57.5% average. S. 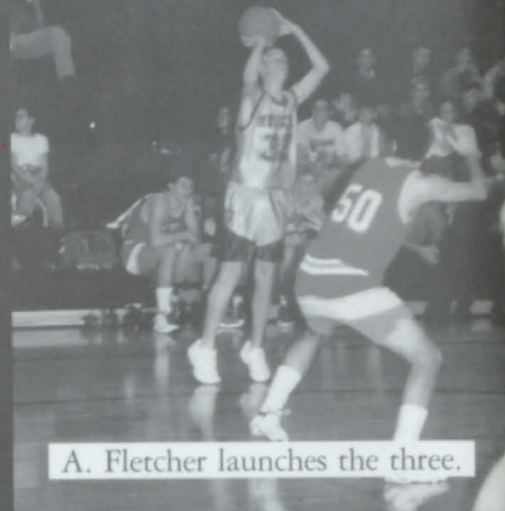
# It's All About... Intensity

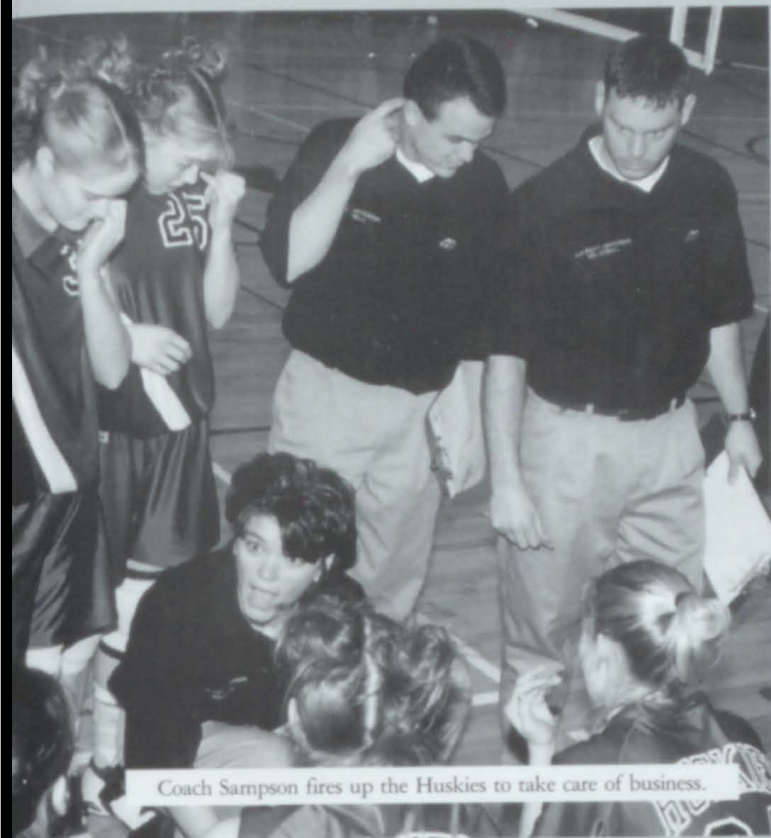

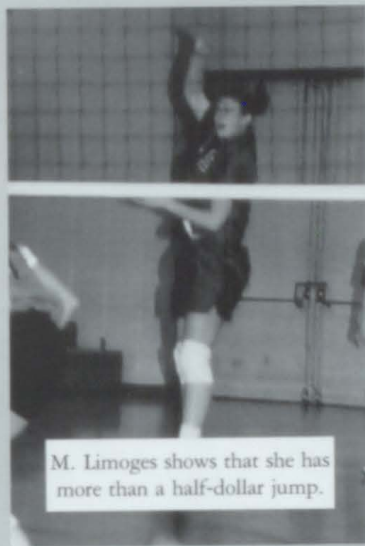

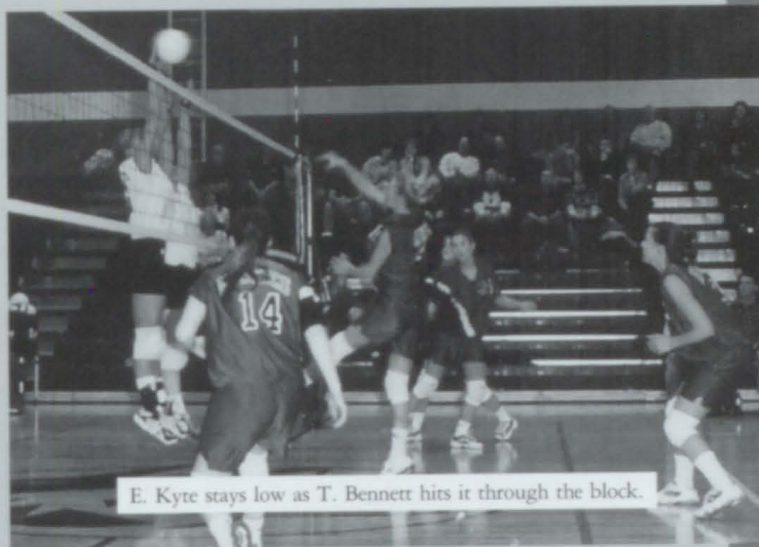

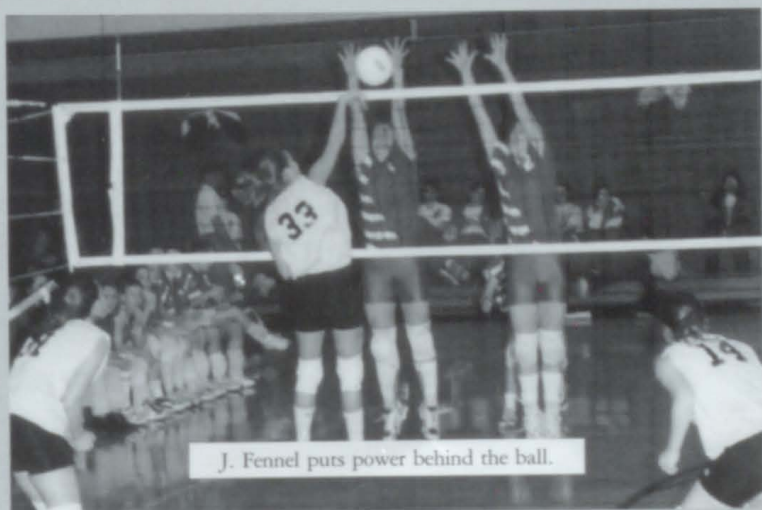

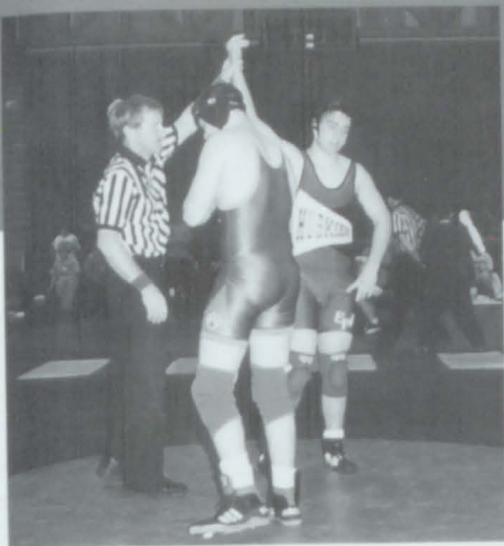

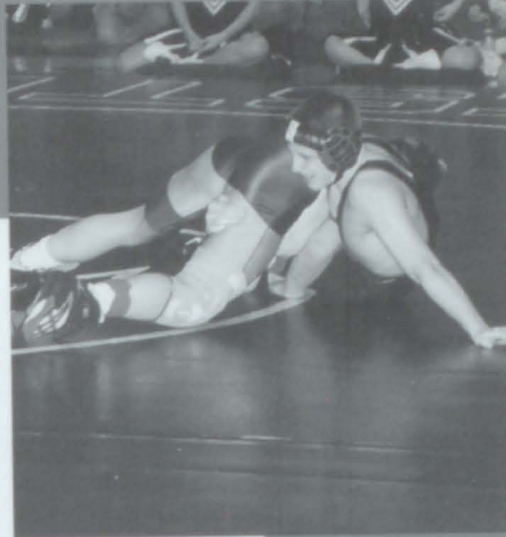

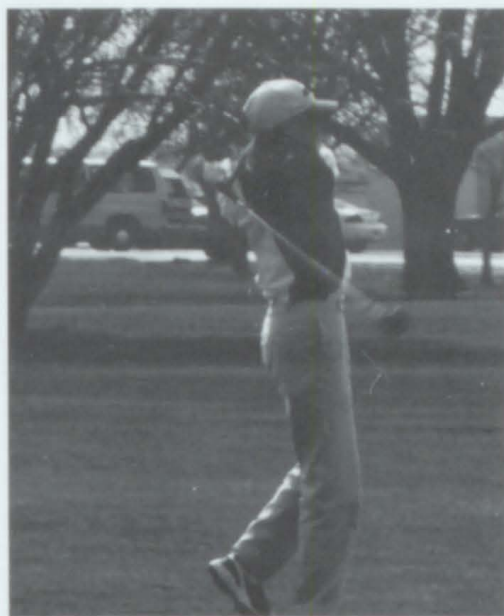

Whether the Huskies were in the first **heat** or the last **heat**, they always came out on top. The 2000 EPJ track and field teams seemed to always know how to handle the **heat** breaking nine school records and qualifying eleven participants for the State A Meet.

Some of the records that were set included the impressive 10.9 100m dash by E.J. Mollet. J. Guenther set the 400m dash record for the boys with a 50.5, and L. 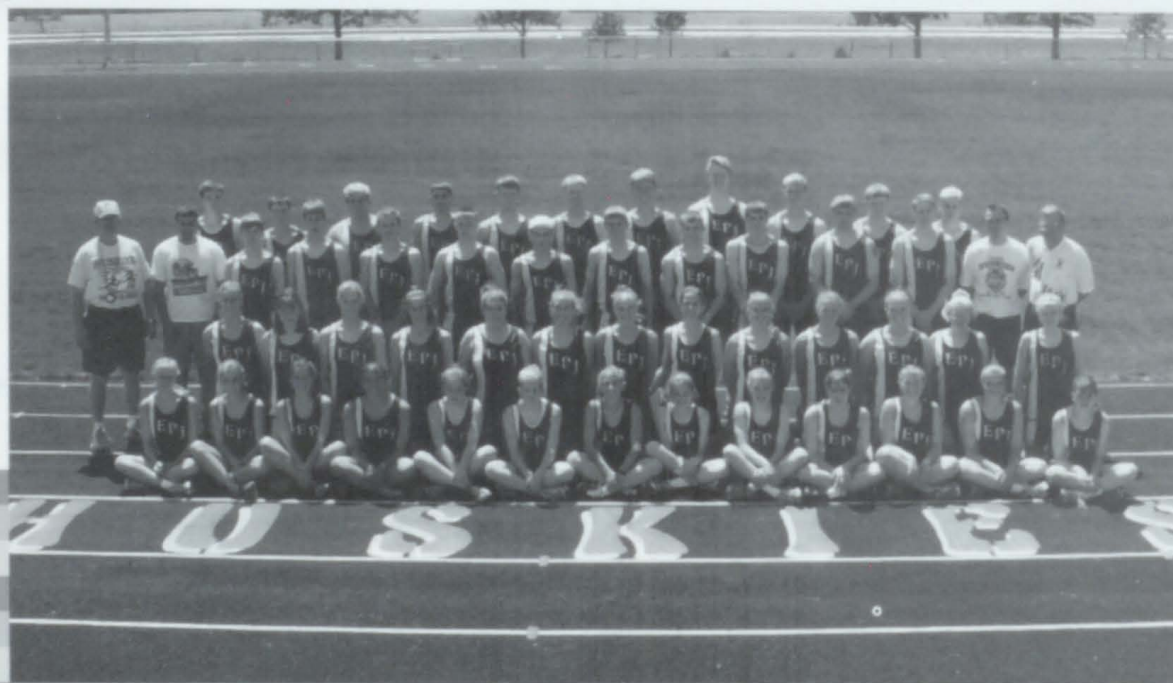

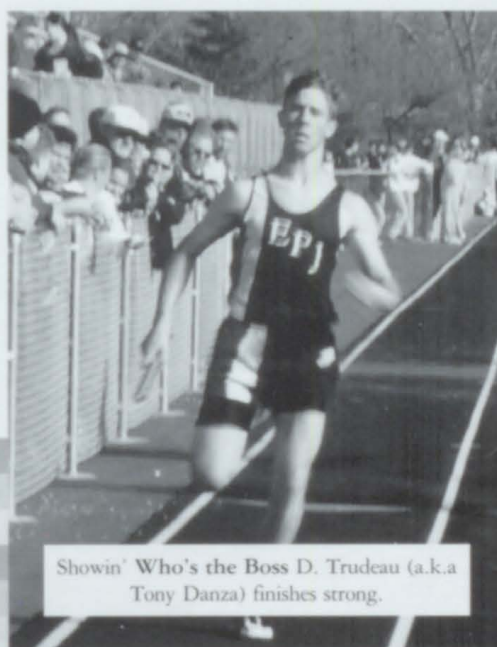

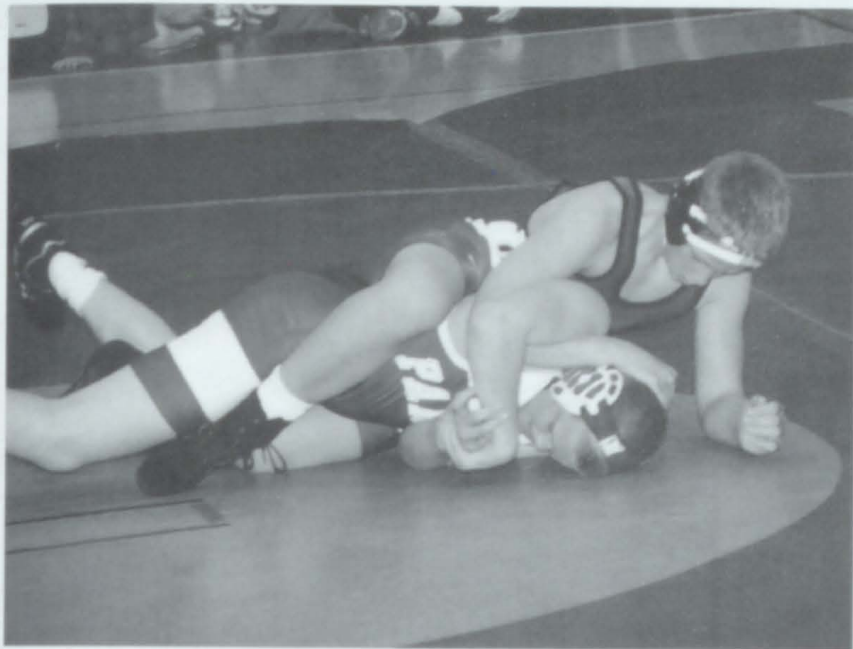

During the school year the Natural Helpers get together for a few training sessions and a picnic in the spring to welcome the new Natural Helpers and say goodbye to the seniors.

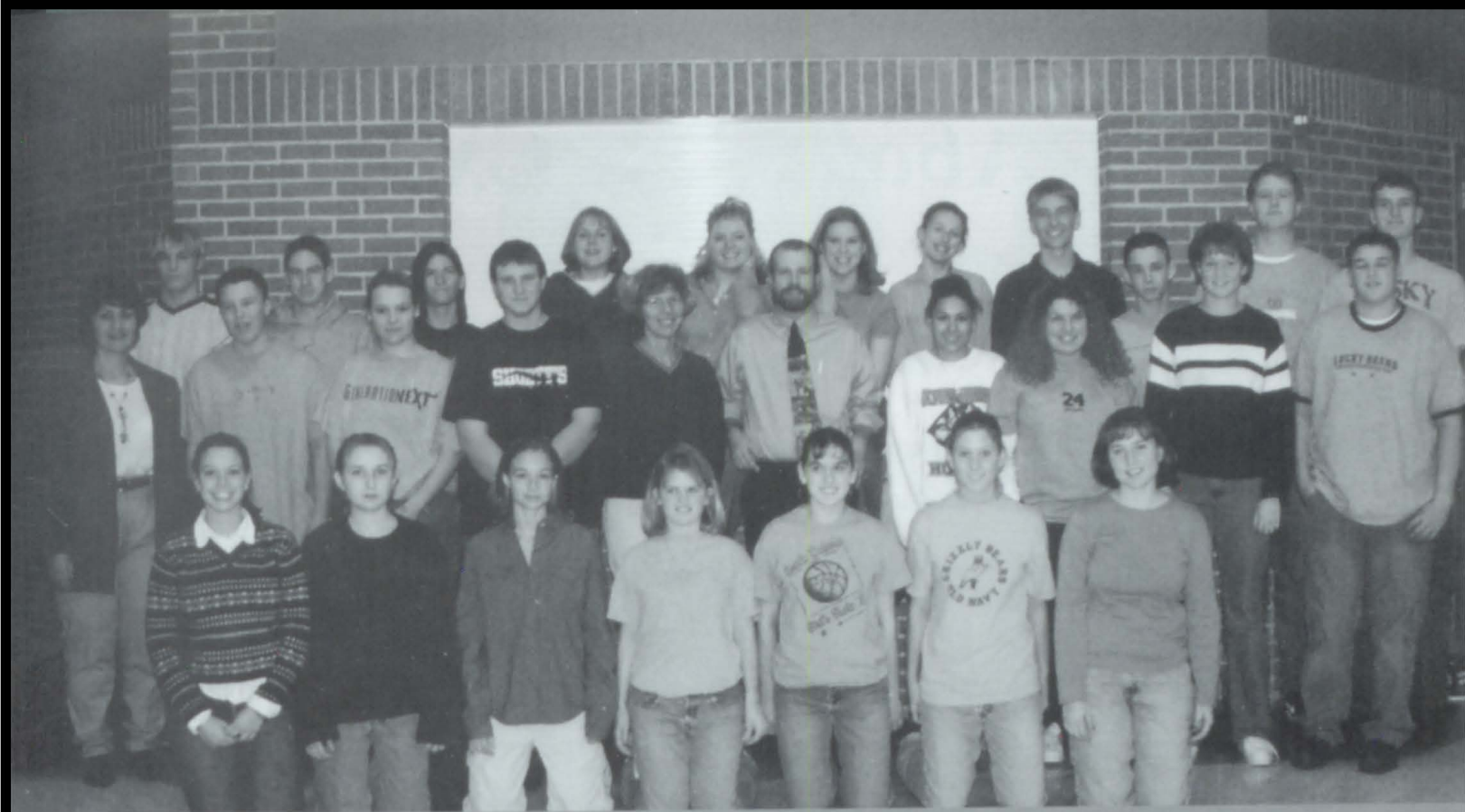

# STUDY HALL



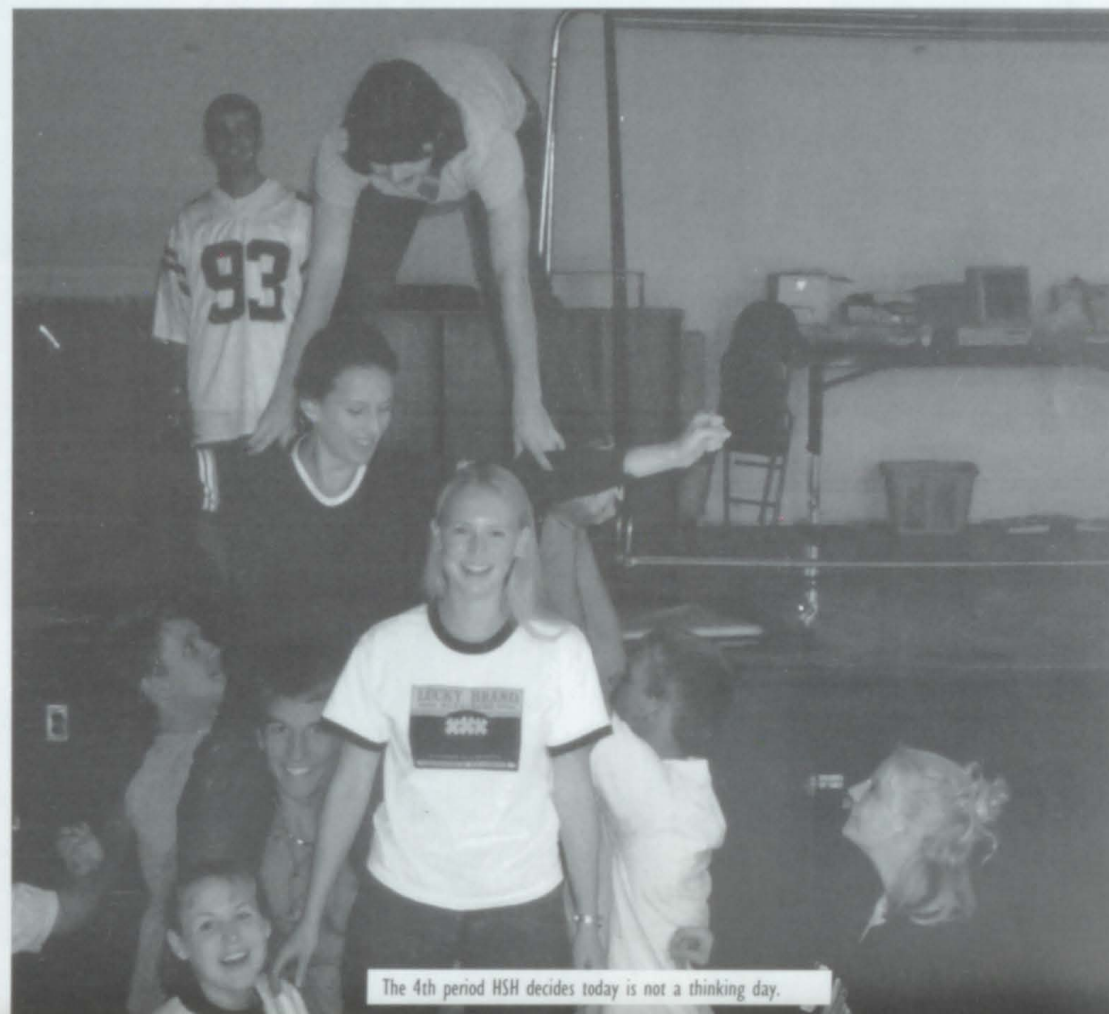

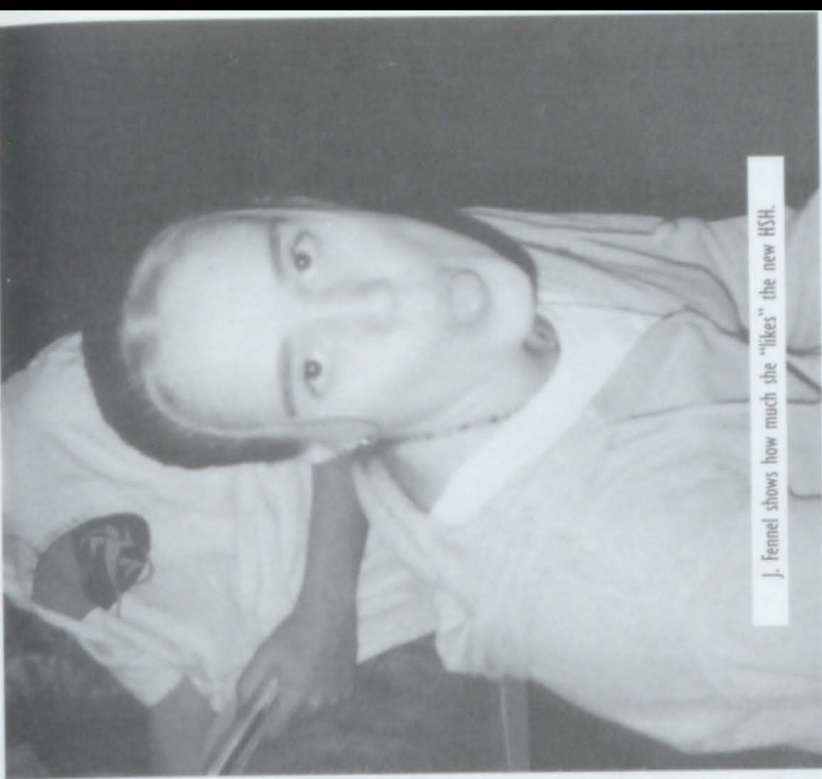
