Rubida ran the ball 58 times for 256 total yards and an average of
42.7 yards per game. A. Girard completed $46.2 \%$ of his pass attempts for 138 yards before he was injured.


Freshman, D. Pirner, took over the QB position and completed $46.6 \%$ of his passes for 437 yards or 87.4 yards per
game. Pirner's favorite receiver, J. Guenthner, caught nine passes for 137 yards gained for an average of 15.2 yards per catch and four touchdowns. S. Rubida caught nine aerials for 160 yards at an average of 13.3 yards per catch. Rubida also scored 5 touchdowns. J Livingston broke the pass reception record for one game by catching eight passes against Canton. A. Girard pulled in seven catches for 71 yards. E. Mollet returned five punts with a return average of 10.2 yards per carry. The Husky's season ended 0-8
All-conference honors went to Eric Schmitz and Dusty Dougherty. Honorable mention honors went to Loren Schmidt, Dan Trudeau and Jake Wahl. Academic all state honors went to seniors Ryan Johnson, Colin Bernard, Jeff Lamoreaux and Ethan Slattery.
