Don't waste that right but work for achievement. Your goals are your own, and no one else's.




Each year an election is held for a new Pres., Vice-Pres., and Secretary-Treasurer.






The team improved both in defensive and offensive playing during the year. The boys also averaged 30 yards rushing per game at the close of the season.



He has received a B.S. degree from South Dakota State University and a M.A. and Ed.S. from the University of South Dakota.




