

The boys' team consisted of Nick Bottger and Bryce Hernandez. Although the teams may have been small, they still did not give up. At each meet. they prevailed. With the girls' place of Second at the Big Sioux Conference Tourney and a Fourth place finish at Regions, the girls proved that even though this year's turnout was not all that big, that did not matter. With a state representative. Bobby McLaury placed 68th. with a time of 17 minutes and 54.5 seconds. Jessica's best time was at the Union County Quad with a time of 17 minutes and 20 seconds. best time happened a time of 13 minutes and Bobby's best time Canton, with a time of seconds.






