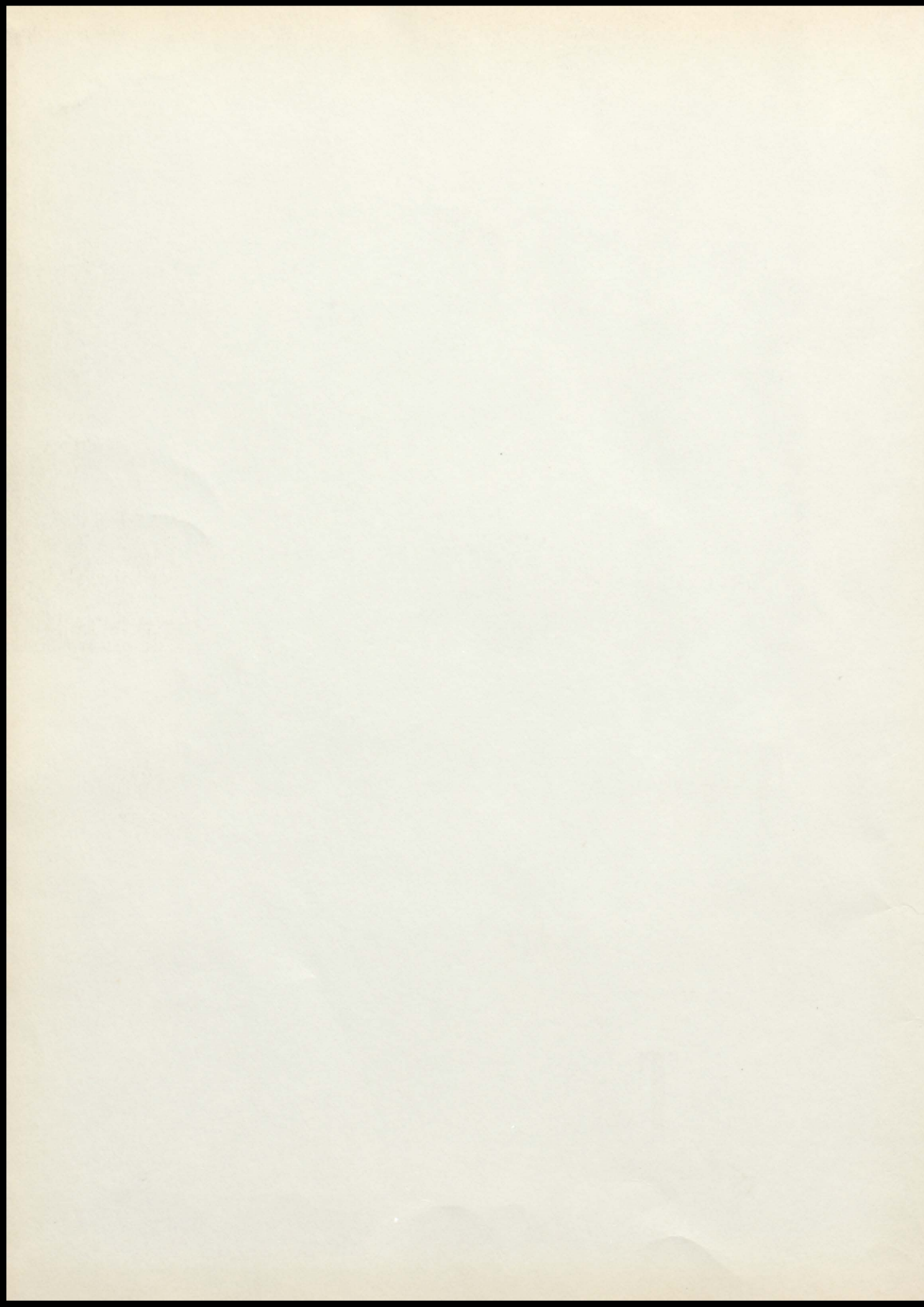

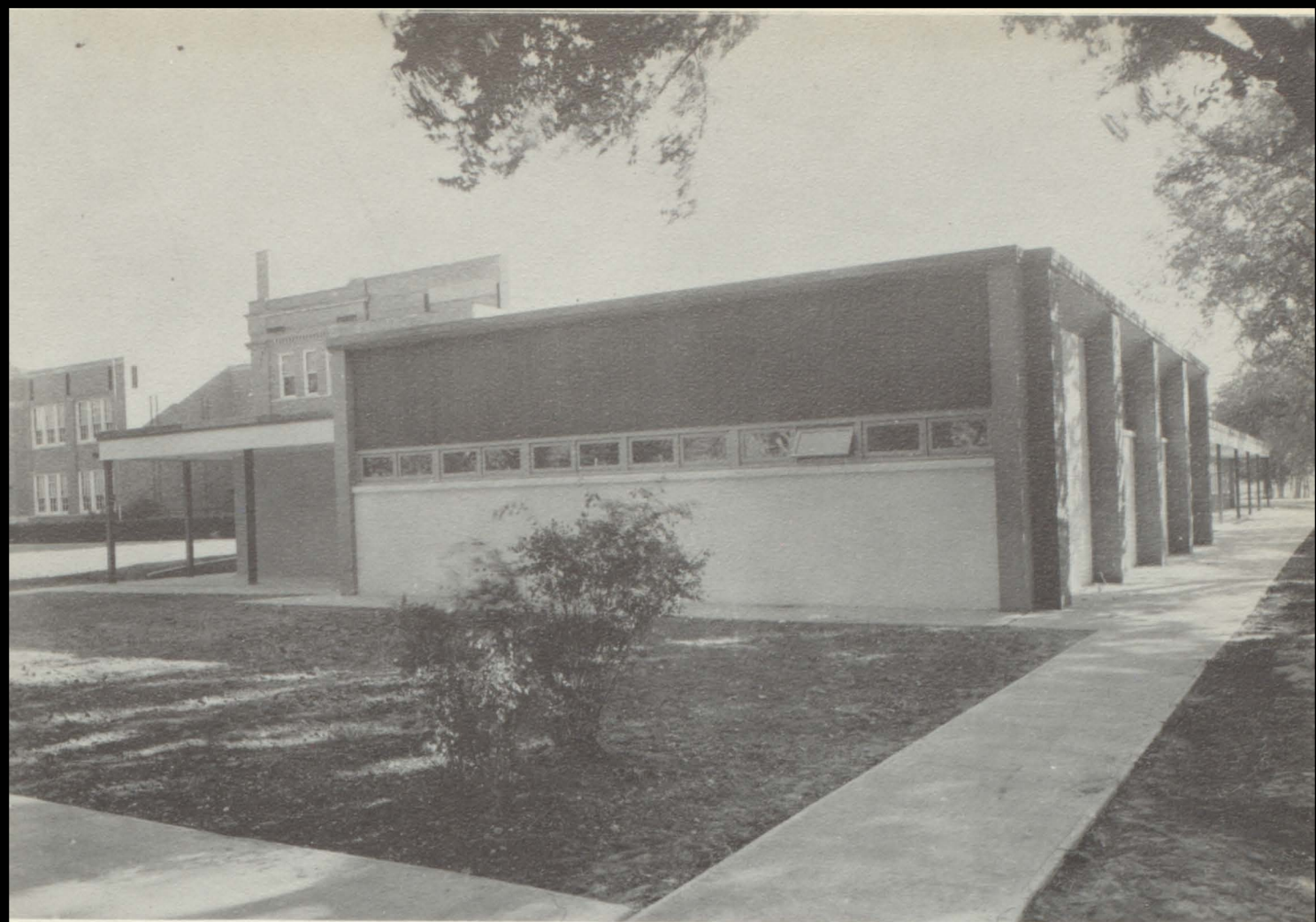

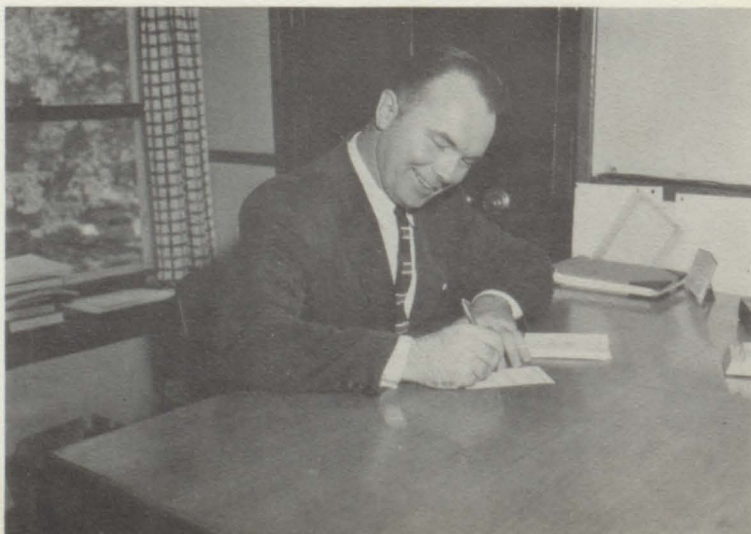
Superintendent

Mr. Jacoby - has been Superintendent of our school for the last four years. Altogether he has been in our school system for ten years.

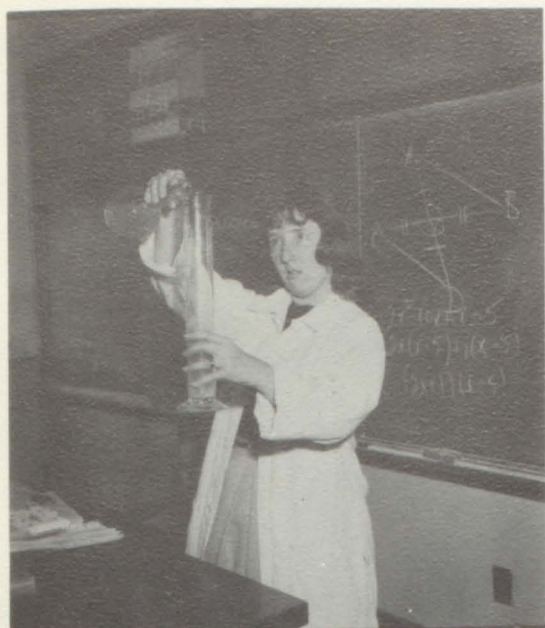

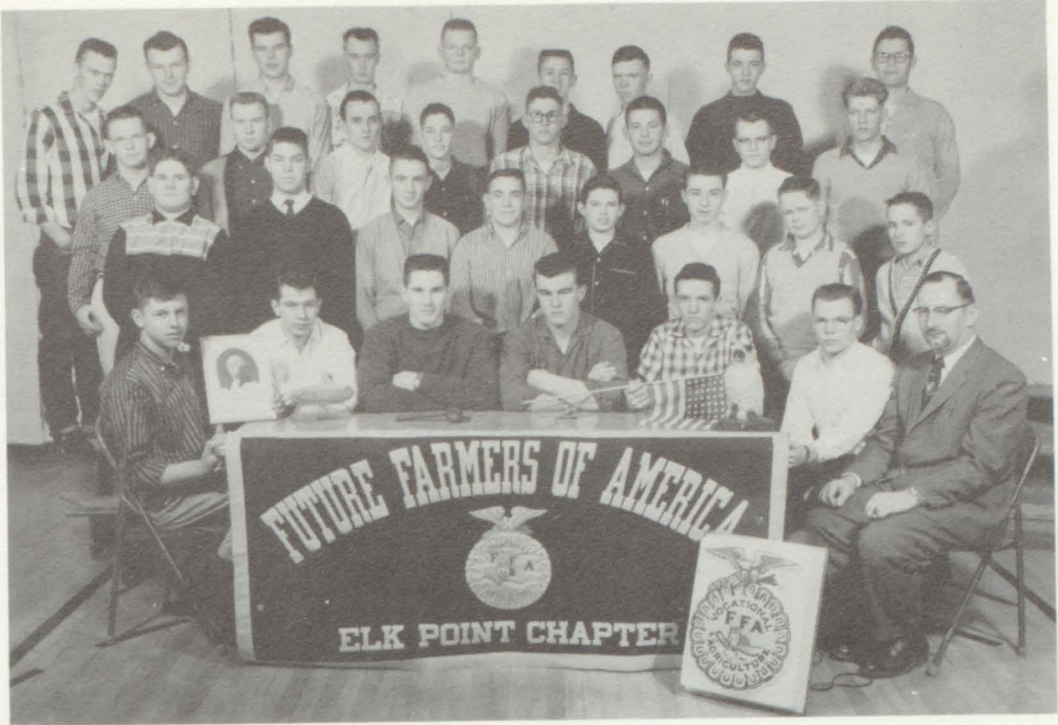

After the coronation a large crowd gathered at the Du Pont Lot for the pep rally and bonfire. Here the Royalty received gifts from the Chamber of Commerce.

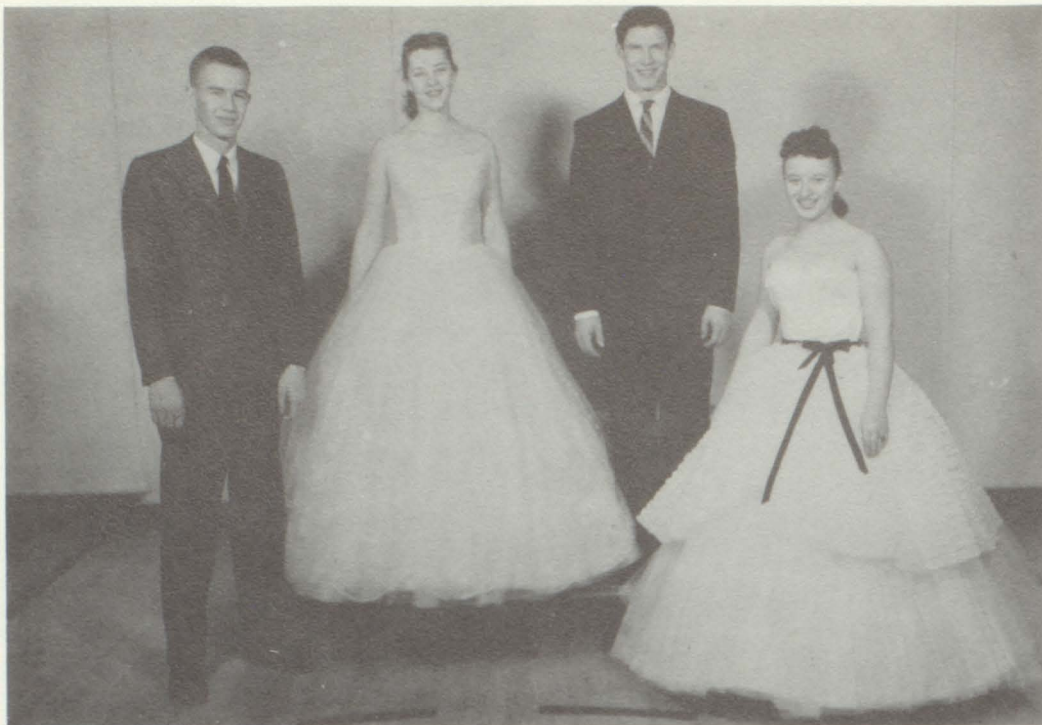
On Friday morning, a pep meeting was held in the auditorium, with each class presenting a skit. A free show at the State Theater by the V. F. W. completed the forenoon.

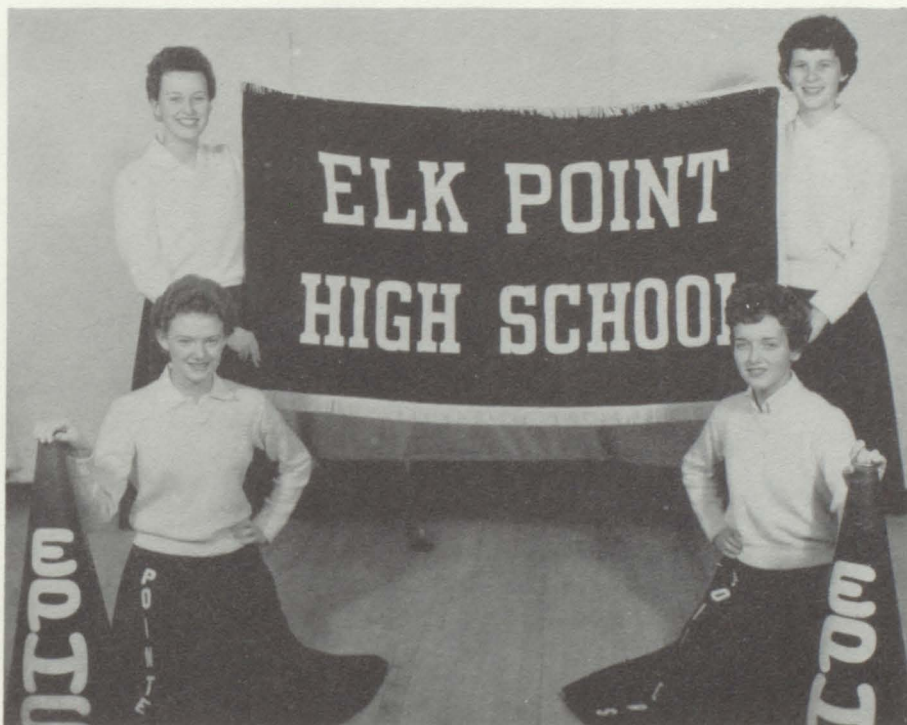
