



Dear Mr. McLane,




Guess Who's Coming To Dinner?

They led the seniors through the year by organizing various activities. They held chili suppers and ran the concessions at basketball games and wrestling matches.



The Visitors







The Homecoming




Whatever Happened To Jack and Jill . . . And . . . And Peace . . . And Romeo And Juliet . . .?
